For 2015-2016, Norway High School made Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) in English Language Arts, Social Studies, and Mathematics. While we are pleased to have reached this important goal, we are continuously working to improve. We appreciate the continued support of parents, staff and our community in this effort.

All students in the Norway-Vulcan school district attend Norway High School. Currently, Norway High School's School Improvement Plan has started a new cycle will focus on maintaining our students' exemplary results in attendance, testing performance, extra-curricular participation, and a high number of students continuing with post secondary school education. The Dickinson-Iron Technical Education Center provides career/technical programs in eleven occupational areas and serves grades 10-12. Norway High School students participate in programs such as Auto Body, Auto mechanics, Construction Trades, Electronics, Graphics and Printing, Health Occupations, Machine Tool, Marketing and Distribution, Programming, and Welding.

Norway High school had a 39% attendance rate for parents during parent-teacher conferences in the 2015-2016 school year. Three students took dual-enrollment courses from Bay College and 39 students participated in online courses and 26 in AP courses with the majority receiving college credit.

Norway High School students and teachers have once again achieved exemplary results for the 2015-2016 school year. It is my sincere pleasure to congratulate our students, staff members, and community who have all played a role in enabling our district to continue with excellent academic and extra-curricular results.
